



Formal Submissions

On behalf of our members FDATA responded to a call for formal submissions by the Treasury Department on the proposed changes to Joint Account – Opt-Out model for Open Banking.



FDATA plays an active role across Aus/ NZ with Open Banking, Regulatory Reform to launch Consumer Data Rights, and calls for the creation of Digital Identity Frameworks. FDATA regularly provided consultation, advisory services, and advocacy with Federal Departments such as the Treasury Department in Australia, the MBIE in NZ, Privacy Offices, Payments Regulators, ACCC and Data Standards Body in Australia.

ACCC / Treasury Consultation

FDATA ANZ's relationship with federal regulators continues to grow in strength. Regular consultation is held between Treasury representatives, members of the Data Standards Board, the Accreditations Team and Compliance and Enforcement divisions of the ACCC. Currently, this occurs on a weekly/bi-weekly basis and will continue to grow in frequency.



Development of NZ CDR

FDATA ANZ has been asked to perform advisory works for the NZ Open Banking ecosystem and the API Centre. The initial works included the development of a blueprint and framework for blank-slate Open Banking with a focus on partnerships. Subsequent advisory will see FDATA ANZ present to the executive of the NZ API Council with a focus on Liability Models, Regulatory Frameworks and Accreditation Models. Representatives of the council include: ASB, Kiwibank, ANZ, BNZ, TSB, Westpac, Paymark, Datacom, Mastercard, SalectNZ, BlinkPay NZ, Yodlee and 3 Independent representatives.
